French Revolution; structure and geopolitic positioning of Ottoman Empire, reasons of its decline; Westernization movements, First and Second Constitutional Monarchy declarations; Libya and Balkan wars; First World War; period before the War of Independence, congresses, National Pact, establishment of Turkish Grand National Assembly.

HIST 102 Principles of Atatürk and History of Turkish Revolution II

(2-0)2

War of Independence; Lausanne Treaty; declaration of the Republic; removal of sultanic rule and caliphate; Atatürk's revolutions; establishment of national economy; Second World War, before and after; Turkish Republic after 1960.

IR 101 World History I

(3-0)7.5

A chronological order of the rise of civilizations from Sumer until the Scientific Revolution.

IR 102 World History II

(3-0)7.5

A chronological order of the rise of civilizations from the Scientific Revolution until the end of the Cold War era.

IR 110 Introduction to Politics

(3-0)6

Introduction to politics and political science; ideologies, constitutions, political cultures, parties, elections, state organs and international relations.

IR 111 Fundamentals Of Law for International Relations

(3-0)7

Basic concepts of law and preliminary matters; general legal concepts and institutions of law and overview of the Turkish Legal System; interaction of law and economics; interrelated areas such as economic and social rights recognised in international legal documents; basic concepts of competition law.

IR 112 Political Psychology

(3-0)6

In-depth explanations about identity, group behavior, leadership cults, voting behavior, media impact, ethnic conflict, nationalism, social movements, terrorism, international security and conflict resolution topics from a political psychology perspective; the impact of political psychology to IR discipline.

IR 201 International Politics

Types of international systems, foreign policy orientations, objectives, instruments such as diplomacy and economic means of influence, foreign policy outputs, conflict resoulutions and all types and processes of

IR 204 International Relations Theory

IR 207 European Political History I

(3-0)6

The diplomatic relations between the European Powers and the Ottoman Empire in the 19th Century starting with the Vienna Congress of 1814; policies of Great Powers of Europe with regard to the Ottoman Empire and the main factors influencing these policies.

IR 211 International Political Economy

(3-0)6

The foreign trade and the distribution of income, economic integration and its political implications and the impacts of technology on foreign trade; international economic institutions and their impact on South-North relations.

IR 212 Research Methods

(3-0)6

Research design, research findings, the use of research techniques, literature review, measurement, sampling, survey, fieldwork, the use of available data, data analysis and presentation.

IR 214 European Political History II

(3-0)6

Major political events of 19th and 20th centuries; a survey of Ottoman Diplomacy in the contex of Eastern Question; political evolution of the Balkans and the Middle East in an interaction with 'European state-system'.

IR 216 History of Political Thought

(3-0)6

Political theory; the meaning of the ?political?; the delving ?underneath? the surface of political practice; the meaning of politics.

IR 231 Departmental English I

(3-0)3

Reading and understanding news analyses in internationally respected English language newspapers; writing cover letters, statement of purpose and similar exercises.

IR 232 Departmental English II

(2-0)3

Analysis of news articles from internationally acknowledged newspapers on current international political, economic and social events; contemporary issues.

IR 301 International Law I

(3-0)5

An introduction to public international law; the nature, major principles, norms and institutions of the international legal system, the relations between municipal and international law.

IR 302 International Law II (3-0)5

The characteristics of the legal personality of states, their relations with individuals within and outside the country; maritime, aviation and space law.

IR 303 Turkish Foreign Policy I (3-0)6

The Turkish foreign policy at the establishment of the Turkish Republic; the main foreign policy issues during Cold War years and the factors affecting Turkish foreign policy in this period; the characteristics of Turkish diplomacy and the structure and organization of the Turkish Foreign Ministry.

IR 304 Turkish Foreign Policy II (3-0)6

Turkish foreign policy from 1960 until today; Turkey?s relations with Europe, the USA and the South America, the Middle East, Russia and the Far East in this period; the foreign policy of Turkey according to the periods of Relative Autonomy, Turkey in the Orbit of Western Block and Turkey in the Orbit of Globalization.

IR 307 Contemporary Politics of the Middle East (3-0)6

The political history, cultural foundations and the socio-economic structures of the Middle East countries, including the Arab States, Iran and Israel; current developments in the region.

IR 309 Turkish Political Life (3-0)4

IR 407 Comparative Politics

(3-0)4

A general development of comparative politics; comparative methodology; significant political issues such as welfare states, party structures, election systems, unitary-federal states, political economy.

IR 408 Human Rights in global Politics

(3-0)4

Aa wide range of topics starting with the foundations of human rights and a historical background on the

development of the notion, human rights in connection to contemporary concepts and/or issues.

IR 409 China: Past and Present

(3-0)4

Conflict resolution as an important definition in IR discipline; the existing conflict resolution actions in world politics; Turkey's current position in conflict resolution.

IR 421 History and Politics of the Balkans

(3-0)6

The historical and political developments of 20th century in the Balkans; the new national-state entities in the Balkans caused by the political and economic crisis; the disintegration of Yugoslavia and afterwards.

IR 422 Rising China: Current Issues in China's Foreign and Economic Policies (3-0)6

International Relations Program Curriculum and Course Description
